

Knobby Knee Net Introduction for Net Control Operators

(For example only – use as guide to compose your own)

(*Salutation*) This is (*Call Sign*) calling the Knobby Knee Net for (*Date*).

My name is (*Name*) and I am located in (*Station Location*).

This is a directed net and I will be acting as your net control this morning.

This Amateur Radio net meets daily, 365 days a year, at 7am local, on a frequency of 147.220 MHz, with a standard positive offset, and a PL access tone of 162.2 Hz.

We use the Verde Valley Amateur Radio Association's 2-meter FM repeater located on Mingus Mountain.

The Knobby Knee Net is open to all licensed Amateur Radio operators.

The Knobby Knee Net is open to discussion of all subjects except religion and politics.

We will always break for emergency traffic no matter when it occurs.

I will now call for check-ins in the following order: Mobiles, Shorts, Echo-links, Regulars and Visitors. Save additional comments for when called for at the end of the net.

1. Mobile stations check in now.
2. Shorts (one turn only) check in now.
3. Echo-link stations check in now.
4. Regulars and Visitors check in now.

Are there any other check-ins or business for the Knobby Knee Net?

I am now closing the Knobby Knee Net at (*Time*). Thank you all for participating this morning. I am now returning the repeater to authorized amateur radio use.

(*Sign off*)

(*Salutation*) = Good Morning or All Amateur Stations, etc (examples)

(*Call Sign*) = net control's call sign

(*Date*) = month/day/year

(*Name*) = net control's name

(*Station Location*) = town or city/state

(*Time*) = local time

(*Sign off*) = (*Call Sign*) Clear (example)
